The opioid work group continues to focus on involvement with local community events and spreading the word about opioid overdose resources, Opioid Overdose and Naloxone Education (REVIVE) and other opioid related initiatives.

<u>FentAlert Challenge</u>- SAMHSA is seeking the best ideas from U.S. youth, aged 14-18, on a community strategy to increase youth awareness, education, and prevention around the dangers of fentanyl, especially the hidden dangers of fake pills and other contaminants that can lead to drug overdose deaths.

Positive Prevention Messaging Presentation given by Community-The Anti-Drug Coalition. During the April 10th FPC Monthly Meeting, Barbara de Nekker with CTAD will be joining us to share information about positive prevention messaging (and the negative impact of scare tactics). Young Adult Survey- (18-25 yr. olds) which is an anonymous, voluntary survey, aimed at young adults residing in Virginia (or attends college in VA) will be disseminated starting on January 15, 2024, and will be available until April 15, 2024. In this survey, questions are asked about alcohol, tobacco/vaping, prescription drug and other drug use, marijuana/cannabis, over the counter (OTC) medications, stimulants, mental health, and gaming/gambling.
